Overview Of Nursery This Term

SPIDERS (AM).

This term we have welcomed five more friends into our morning session, they have settled really well and our existing Spiders have done a wonderful job in making them feel welcome and help teach them our routine.

We have been exploring the theme "under the sea" and have looked at three core books, "Peekaboo, under the sea" "There's a shark out there" and "The seashore". We have been focussing on a few sea creatures; Shark, crab, starfish, fish, turtle and dolphin. The children have loved labelling the animals and playing our "Kims game" which helps to develop their memory skills. The children have really loved exploring the sea animals in different textures and media, we have had water, jelly, custard and pom, poms. We have made our own jellyfish, turtles and fish exploring paint and collage materials.

We have looked at chinese new year exploring the lucky colour red and had ago at making pancakes for pancake day, which most of us liked.









SPIDERS (PM).

Our afternoon children from the Spiders group are settling in very well. They happily explore both indoor and outdoor environments, choosing activities and resources they enjoy. We have started learning two songs: "Hello" and "Goodbye," and we are using objects and visuals to help children understand our routine. During playtime, we are learning how to share toys, and we are practicing one of our favourite games: passing a ball around the circle. Most of the children enjoy one of our core books, "Where is Spot?" We recently had the opportunity to help mix ingredients together to make pancakes, and then we all enjoyed eating them together. We love to see our children happily engaged.







Overview Of Nursery This Term continued...

This term in main nursery we have been learning about our topic "Under the Sea". The children have enjoyed learning about the different types of creatures that live under the sea using our story "Commotion in the Ocean." We have been learning about the different features of sea creatures such as which of them have a shell, fins or sharp pointy teeth. We watched a video of what life under the sea would look like and how it was different from where we live. We also looked at a real fish and tasted yummy tuna sandwiches. We have also been learning about Chinese New Year and Pancake day.





Overview of Reception This Term

This half term has been great fun, we started the Spring term learning all about a different country called Italy throughout our Global community week and compared it to Fishermead. We learned different dances, we tasted different Italian food and also learnt some Italian words. Our learning then moved onto 'Under the Sea', where we have learned a lot about fish and what the sea is. We learnt the sea is very salty and big and some sea creatures have not been discovered yet, so we thought we would create what might be found, our own sea creatures were inspired by a story book, some of the creatures for example lobguin and narster. Can you guess what sea creatures inspired these names? To learn all about different parts of a fish Miss Hawkins brought in a fish from the corner fish market and it was very smelly. If we wanted to we could touch or hold the fish afterwards we labelled the fish. We also know that sharks are fish and have learnt some facts about them. This term in Literacy we have also worked very hard writing our own describing poems inspired by the book, Hooray Fish, using new words to describe our own fish.

In maths we have been learning about 6, 7 and 8 and all different ways to make them. We have also been trying really hard to remember the number bonds to 5, as well as some doubling all in practical fun ways. Hedgehog team would like to thank all the parents that have been coming in on a Friday morning 8:35-8:55 helping their child with maths, it has been wonderful to see you.

Overview of Reception This Term continued

Throughout P.E we have been learning different dances to nursery rhymes and adapting these dances to different emotions and different animals from under the sea. This term we have had lots of heavy rain, which has made outdoor very fun! We have got wellies and wetsuits to help protect our clothes, but sometimes we have so much fun we get wet through these, please can you make sure your child has spare clothes on their peg. This can be in a carrier bag and doesn't need to be uniform.

Our last week ended with pancake day, they were extremely tasty! We mixed the batter following instructions, and attempted to write our own instructions. We watched them being cooked and flipped and chose our own toppings, all pictures are on tapestry. If you need help with tapestry, please come and talk to Miss Hawkins at the end of the day and she can help you.









Overview of KS1 This Term

KS1 started the term looking at different countries. Rabbits learned about Ghana, Squirrels learned about Algeria and Owls learned about Bangladesh. We learned about their local cuisines, where they are located, and finding out fun facts to do with each countries.

Our first topic 'Zero to Hero' focused on different people across history. We learned about Michael Jordan, Malala Yousufzai and Thomas Edison. We found out why they are historically important and facts about their lives. They all have achieved different things, some personal and some have had a huge impact on our lives. We now know what a timeline is and how to put information in chronological order. Over the year we will continue our timeline with different facts.

Overview of KS1 This Term continued...

We focused on Thomas Edison's achievements to learn about light and light sources. The children loved when we had a fire in the playground. Obviously, learning about fire safety first. We learned what circuits are and how to power a light bulb.

We learned how to search information safely on a Chromebook and pick out key information with support.

In English we created stories about Mickey Mouse, using T'he Sorcerer's Apprentice 'as the hook. They focused on what Mickey could do with the magical hat. Using adjectives, expanded noun phrases and much more to develop their writing.

In maths there has been a big focus on numbers. Some children have been focusing on numbers and place value to 20. Ordering and writing number bonds and learning about commutative facts. There has also been a focus on multiplication and division for some children. Looking at grouping objects, arrays, and repeated addition.

It has been a very busy term and the children will be ready for rest at half term.

Overview of Foxes This Term


Foxes have had an amazing time having an 'under the sea adventure'. We have been looking at naming the different creatures you can find under the sea and have been talking about their different characteristics.

Foxes have also worked hard to make their own creatures. We have been using a range of resources, including; Duplo, painting, colouring, play dough and junk modelling. We have been persevering with our scissor skills and have been practicing our own mark making.

We have been learning a few new songs and the children have often asked to practice their favorites. 'If you're happy and you know it' is the current winner. The children have also enjoyed exploring the musical instruments.

We have all had a busy, but very fun half term.
