### Overview Of Nursery This Term

We started learning all about ourselves through our topic 'Marvellous me!' We enjoyed talking about our families, looking at real photographs, making a big family tree and using mirrors to look at the features of our own faces. We learnt 'Hello' and 'Goodbye' songs and spoke about our different ages. Next we started looking at the story 'Dear Zoo'. We all thought this story was very funny! Mr Morris found a very exciting delivery at the school front door addressed to Nursery. We read the card and realised it was from the zoo. We all had to guess what we thought could be inside the box. The children were very anxious to look inside and made great predictions. We were really happy to find a dog inside who liked lots of cuddles. We really enjoyed talking about all the different animals in the story and loved moving like these in PE. We especially liked stomping like an elephant and slithering like a snake. We had a go at mark making the different animals' footprints on a giant piece of paper and even played animal bingo!

### **Overview of Reception This Term**

The children in Reception have settled really quickly. They were really enjoyed taking part in the baseline assessments. This term, we have learnt about families and who is in our own

family. Then we focused on our bodies and how to look after ourselves. We learnt about healthy foods, the importance of brushing our teeth and how to keep our body fit. We started to look at what the harvest festival is about and why we celebrate it; learning the songs 'Big Red Combine Harvester and 'Autumn Leaves'. We then looked at Autumn and the changes

in our local area, finishing off learning about Andy Goldsworthy and his use of natural materials to create art-

#### Overview of KS1 This Term

This half – term, KS1's Topic work has been about the artist, Vincent Van Gogh. We found out lots of facts about him and explored some of his art work, especially his most famous piece called 'Sunflowers'. We drew and painted sunflowers and created a lovely collage. We even posed in a hat and produced a self-portrait in the style of Van Gogh!

Since autumn is here, we went on a walk and collected conkers and leaves; some of us even spotted squirrels! We talked about the signs of autumn, harvest and some children wrote a nonchronological report and poem about autumn.

The children have also been on a visit to the theatre to watch 'Bedknobs and Broomsticks' and some of us wrote an account about our trip. In English, some of us have been writing a story based on a familiar tale, such as Room on the Broom, Grendel and Handa's Surprise.

In Maths, we have continued to look at place value to ensure that children have a good understanding of number value. We have now moved onto addition and will continue this next half- term. KS1 have also just completed a music based unit about long and short sounds. Our values of the month have enabled us to learn about ways of being independent and kind. In ICT, we have explored technology around the home and learnt about staying safe online.


