Overview Of Nursery This Term

In nursery we have been finding out about the children's interests and looking at different celebrations. We started enjoying the spectacle of fireworks and Diwali. The children loved making rockets using bubbles to power them. The children were very creative with lots of bright colours and patterns. We used playdough to make Diva lamps to celebrate the festival of lights.

Next the children had great fun finding out about pets. The children were highly engaged in our school vets role play activities and got hands on finding ways to make the animals feel better. We spent time reading stories, looking at pets and describing them. This linked in with Children in Need where we enjoyed stories cuddling up with our teddies.

We had our own global week but focused on our lovely local area. We looked at videos of our local area and what is in and around Fishermead.

To finish off the term we have looked at winter and Christmas. The children loved learning how to melt ice. We have learnt about the story of Christmas and learnt lots of wonderful songs. The children have been very creative making lots of lovely things.

Overview of Reception This Term

In Reception we had a great time learning about fireworks and Diwali. Learning why people celebrate them and the traditions around them. We created our own Rangoli patterns using ice and fire work pictures. Then we focused on one of our core books 'Stick Man'. The children loved these three weeks and we could have carried it on longer. We even made our own Stickman.

As a class we created our own class story. Coming up with characters, events and settings. The children showed wonderful imagination with flying fish characters making appearances.

To finish the term we loved learning about Christmas. We learnt the Christmas story and were becoming well practised with our nativity. The children loved creating their own presents in the roleplay area, demonstrating excellent fine and gross motor skills.

Overview of KS1 This Term

We have been all spaced out in Key Stage One this half term! Our Space topic was chosen because a very exciting event happened in our playground... the nose cone from The International Space Station crash landed near our outdoor classroom! Luckily we were not inside the classroom at the time, and Mr Morris was ready to spring into action with his fire extinguisher! Our hero! We had an email



from an astronaut aboard the Space Station so we decided to find out more about what it was like to live in Space. We carried out our own scientific investigations into materials and insulation and used the results to design and make our own space helmets. Rabbits and Owls made some fabulous helmets, but Squirrels class tried a new material and the helmets came out looking like icebergs! Oh well, I am sure Squirrels class will make improved versions next time! We also researched and wrote about astronauts, we found out a lot about Neil Armstrong, the first man to walk on the moon! We wrote reports about the most famous astronaut in history and lots of the children can repeat the famous words he said as he stepped out of The Eagle onto the surface of the moon. We were so inspired we had our own astronaut training school where we had to taste freeze dried food and study moon rocks!

We have had a big focus on history this half term, as we not only learned about the Space race of the 1960's but we also learned why we hold Remembrance Day on November 11th. We showed our respect by making poppy wreaths and learning about the bravery of the soldiers throughout history. We went even further back in history and found out why we have fireworks on November 5th to celebrate the failure of the Gunpowder Plot.

We learned about Diwali and made diva lamps to join in the celebrations. As the term has progressed we have also learned about the Nativity story and have learned songs to sing in our Christingle performance. We celebrate all religions in our school community as one of our school values this term has been tolerance.

As always we have worked hard to make progress with our reading and writing skills, applying these skills to write about all of our topic learning. We have continued to improve our number and calculation skills in Maths, explaining how we found our answers. We have also learned how to describe 2D and 3D shapes using the correct mathematical language, and we have started to use measuring skills.

Overview of KS1 This Term Continued...

In Rabbits Meadow we have been spotting signs of Autumn and talking about the weather as it has changed to Winter. We have used The Gruffalo and Whatever Next core books to support our learning. We have been acting out the stories and developing our language and vocabulary by talking in structured sentences. We have learnt about forests and space. In Maths we have been adding and subtracting numbers to 10 and trying really hard to use the vocabulary more and less. In Phonics we have been learning lots of tricky words and segmenting and blending words too. We have been squeezing, rolling, turning and painting to make our writing muscles stronger and practising writing our names.

We have loved exploring Christmas resources like tinsel and baubles and reading lots of Christmas stories. Keep helping us learn the words to new vocabulary as you experience things over the holidays. We wish all of our wonderful Rabbits a very merry Christmas.

Next term, we are learning about Owl babies as we settle back into school, then we are flying to the other side of the world to learn about Australia, the rainforest, the outback and the great barrier reef. We will continue to write simple words, talk in sentences and add and subtract numbers to 10. We will use measures in our learning and explore shapes.
