Overview Of Nursery This Term

"Who has been sitting on my chair"?

Nursery have had a fun and busy half term and have particularly enjoyed learning about Goldilocks and the three bears. We have been fully engaged in exciting activities, such as; retelling the story using puppets, learning about sizes, painting the characters, making play dough bears, learning how to draw a bear using 2D shapes and singing along to a new song all about Goldilocks and the bears.

We have also had the exciting opportunity to watch chicks hatching from their eggs. We spoke about the use of an incubator and we observed how the chicks changed. We loved having these special visitors.

We ended by looking at Spring and the changes this season brings. We have started exploring the plants and flowers outside and have enjoyed learning about baby animals. Overview of Reception This Term

In reception we have been hands-on learning about how things grow. We learnt a lot about plants, including the parts of a plant, what they need to grow and how to grow them. We planted sunflowers and herbs and hopefully the sunflowers are growing nicely at home.

We had our friend Ted come back from his travels to learn about pancake day. We even tried some pancakes and they were yummy.

We were very lucky to have some fluffy visitors come and join us. We learnt about how chicks grow and saw them hatch from their eggs. To finish off the term we learnt about Easter and why it is celebrated by Christians.

We have had a great half term and look forward to the summer term.

Overview of KS1 This Term

The Rabbits in the Meadow have loved learning all about under the sea this half term. We have learnt about the great barrier reef off the coast of Australia and the rock pools around the coast of the UK. We have learnt new vocabulary and facts about the creatures that live under the sea. We have explored rhyming texts and written simple sentences using the sounds we know.

In phonics we continue to learn phase 3 sounds in particular digraphs; not one but two letters that make up a spelling like ai igh oa etc. In Maths we continue to consolidate our addition and subtraction within 10. We have also developed our positional language and measured using non standard units.

We continue to be kind to each other and share and take turns.

Overview of KS1 This Term Continued...

This half term we have continued with our topic of Australia, our focus has shifted from the Daintree Rainforest to the Great Barrier Reef. We designed and created our dioramas after researching the sea life amongst the Coral Reef. We have also looked at the culture of Aboriginal people. We have learnt about some of their creation stories and written some ourselves, such as Tiddalick the Frog and How the Birds Got Their Colours. The children really enjoyed reading and re-telling these stories. We have looked at different Aboriginal arts and symbols and created our own.

This term we have seen a transition to a new reading and phonics scheme which will support the children with reading and writing at their level. Some children have been learning how to measure and compare length in their maths lessons. Other children have been learning how to apply multiplication skills in order to solve division problems and have started their lessons on fractions.

As always spend time reading with your child (ren) at home, it is extremely important.

Healthy 5 to 11 year olds will be offered the COVID-19 vaccine from the beginning of April. Vaccinations will take place outside of school, in vaccination centres, pharmacies, GP surgeries and walk-in centres.

For 5 to 11 year old and 12 to 15 year old vaccinations, you can book COVID-19 vaccination appointments online, at a vaccination centre or pharmacy, or <u>find a walk-in COVID-19 vaccination site</u> without needing an appointment.
