For the whole month of January there were 53 occasions when children were late. Time lost in the mornings can mount up quickly in lost education and cause disruption for other children in the class.




Tuesday 25th February



- 2 Large Eggs
- 300ml Milk
- 1 Tbsp Sunflower or Vegetable Oil Plus

A Little For Frying

- Lemon Wedges, To Serve (Optional)
- Caster Sugar, To Serve (Optional)



- Set aside for 30 mins to rest if you have time, or start cooking straight away.
- Set a medium frying pan or crêpe pan over a medium heat and carefully wipe it with some oiled Kitchen paper
- When hot, cook your pancakes for 1 min on each side until golden, keeping them warm in a low oven as you go.
- Serve with lemon wedges and caster sugar, or your favourite filling.
